COMPETITIONS REPORT

We all thought 2021 would be different to 2020, however it turns out it was very similar with lots of time in lockdown due to the Covid 19 pandemic. Even though there were lots of disruptions throughout the year we still managed good participation across the programs which was a great result.

When we could play, the games were fun, everyone loved being back on the court and there was a lot of great energy, it was a great place to be. Although the year was a little disappointing for everyone we ended it on a high playing back on the court we love. We look forward to welcoming everyone back to our netball programs in 2022.

Club Competition—Autumn Season

It was fantastic to welcome back all our clubs and teams for Autumn 2021. We had 189 Teams register to compete across the age groups from NetSetGo Under 9 to Open. We had our COVID safe plans ready to go for round 1 on 12/13th Feb and ready to get the season underway. Round 1 was delayed until 19/20 Feb after a short lock down. Games continued under varying levels of COVID safe restrictions. Lockdowns again loomed and COVID safe restrictions tighten as we approached the final rounds. NetSetGo U9 games & presentations took place on June 18. Grand Finals took place on June 19 featuring teams ranked 1 & 2 on the ladder.



Wednesday Night Ladies Competition

With lockdowns impacting 2021 again we still managed to have 28 teams register to play in our indoor Wednesday Night competition. We want to thank our teams, umpires and staff for their patience and support—especially following each new set of regulations each time we came out of lockdowns and easing of restrictions.



Walking Netball

We have 10 regular participants in our casual sessions of Walking Netball. Additional participants come in and out of the sessions. These sessions are offered 10am & 1pm Mondays during Term. 10am is an all ages session and 1pm is a over 65s session. They enjoy the modified rules in a relaxed and fun atmosphere. The coffee in the café provides an important social connection for many of our participants.

We ran a successful Come & Try Walking Netball section on Friday 23rd April alongside other Walking Sports. We had many players participant in fun netball drills and walking netball games.

We had 8 teams register for our Evening Walking Netball Competition. A traditional competition which includes a regular fixture, ladders and season with set teams. It is a social, fun, and participation focused competition with no finals. Players create and enter their own team, to play in this traditional format with a social twist and modified rules. We were 6 rounds into the competition and then Covid hit, we had to cancel all the games which we thought would only be for a short time however with restrictions in force it ended up being the whole year that we couldn't run these competitions which was really disappointing for everyone.

Junior Boys Netball Competition

We kicked off another season of Junior Boys Netball at Maroondah Nets. For Boys who love their netball. Games started 4.30pm onwards during school terms. Umpires are provided. Autumn 2022 saw 6 teams had start our Junior boys competition season. We played 6 rounds and once again COVID restrictions forced the season to end.

Netball at Home

We went back in to lockdown over Winter. We stayed in touch with our Netball community online through Instagram, Facebook and our web site. We provided Netball Challenges to complete at home, Netball Fitness ideas, Netball Skills to do at home alongside some Wellbeing tips. The Netball Victoria homecourt series was a unique opportunity to workout with elite players at home.



Spring Back to Netball Season

As we emerged from lockdown, restrictions slowly relaxed. Each time we updated our COVID safe protocols. October saw our clubs come back to training at the courts.

Spring Back to Netball commenced with Round 1 on 5th & 6th November. The season was 6 weeks aimed at getting maximum participation. 189 club teams participated in Spring Back to Netball season. Original team entries for Spring were 199 with 10 withdrawing by the time we started the season.

It was a great atmosphere to see all the clubs, players, coaches & umpires back on court. Thank you to everyone for their patience and support—especially in following the regulations each time these were tightened and eased.

Mid week Ladies Social Competition returned for a short social season. Our Casual sessions of Walking Netball recommenced.

Umpiring

Who would have thought that we would have another year of stops and starts for community netball?

2021 proved to be another very inconsistent year of playing/umpiring and not playing/umpiring due to Covid lockdowns and restrictions.

For the MENA Umpiring Program, the Autumn season started on a very positive note with 26 beginner umpires (from 11 of our Clubs) attending an "Introduction to Umpiring" Workshop with Jo Davidson and all of our MENA umpire badge testers participating in an "Unpacking the Competencies" session that supported their Netball Australia tester endorsement.

As Netball Australia had granted Victorian netball a COVID exemption that allowed for umpires to be tested on games with 9-minute quarters, intensive training of our training program umpires and 2 of our B squad umpires was implemented.

The "Spring Back to Netball" season in November was a thankful return to netball for our umpires. Club coordinators worked hard to make sure that there were umpires on every game. It was great to

see how happy umpires were to be back at netball again. There was no umpiring training during this season.

I am very proud to say that at the end of the year, 2 of our MENA C Grade umpires were "Talent Identified" at the Eastern Region Championships in November. Financial Overview



Treasurers Report

Profit and Loss

For the year ended 31 December 2021, Melbourne East Netball Association made a surplus of \$76,922. This is an extraordinary result, primarily due to grants and COVID stimulus of \$112,986 received rather than operations. Of this, \$98,850 was a combination of JobKeeper and Victorian Government assistance packages, and while not a true operating result the boost to the Association's retained earnings is welcomed given the still uncertain environment we continue to operate in.

The Association again had to issue credits and refunds for our greatly interrupted Spring season, and another stop-start year made it more difficult to review and greatly alter café operations as planned. However, in the last few operating weeks of the year, the changes that had been put in place were starting to take effect and the returns were improving.

Bank Accounts

Melbourne East Netball Association remains debt free and in a strong cash position with \$190,683 Cash at Bank at years end. When reviewing the Balance Sheet please note that due to a change made in the Accounting package, the Term Deposit now sits under the Bank section rather than under Current Assets.

A view to 2022

After 2 years of COVID-interrupted play, the start to 2022 has seen a drop a team numbers across all MENA competitions, but hopefully Spring season will see a return to bigger numbers. Following the resignation of our Café manager, the café operations continue to be modified and are improving although ongoing staffing is proving to be a hurdle.

Today we set our 2023 Affiliation Fees at an unchanged \$10 due by 1st February 2023
