

Club Competition

Melbourne East Netball Association had a very successful year with 183 teams register for our Autumn Club Competition and we had 197 teams register for our Spring Club Competition. It was great seeing everyone back on the court and enjoying the year with no interruptions. Overall, a very fun year being back and playing our favourite game.





Wednesday Night Ladies Competition

Umpiring

2022 has seen considerable growth in the • MENA Umpiring Program. After 2 years of very little netball, it has been time for MENA umpiring to strengthen and grow.

Although umpire numbers have been similar • to previous years, a total of 110 in Autumn and 117 in Spring (115 in 2021), the greatest difference is in the decreasing numbers of qualified umpires and an increase in number • beginner and learner umpires. Consequently, there has been an emphasis on growing the numbers of qualified umpires and developing the umpiring skills and techniques of all MENA umpires - beginner • to badged.

In 2022:

- Jo Davidson ran two "introduction to Umpiring" sessions for beginner umpires. Both sessions were very well in supporting these umpires (a total of Grade umpire accreditation. 40 across our 13 clubs) as they start their umpiring journey.
- We introduced an umpiring workshop program - "Talking Umpiring". These sessions were facilitated by Jo Davidson; • were topic specific and relevant to any level of umpire at MENA. A total of 6 • workshops were held in 2022; all • had sessions strong attendance numbers from most clubs. Notes were taken at each session and can be used • to further support umpires.

- MENA Umpiring Staff continue to support Club umpire trainers at the courts and there is also a mentoring package available for Club umpire trainers.
- We increased the number of MENA trainers in the C Grade training Program which meant that this program was able to expand
- MENA is very lucky to have 12 endorsed testers and 2 cadet testers that are available to test umpires for a Netball Australia C Grade badge at any time through the year.
- We had umpires at the Representative Regional **Program** tournaments; Championships for Chisholm and Association Championships where we had umpires selected to enter the Netball Victoria pathway.

Representative Netball

2022 saw our first 'normal' Representative year Player Achievements for some time, there was a lot to be excited about.

Once again we held our trials in late November, with our Rep Coaches & independent selectors picking 17 & Under teams x 2, 15 & Under x 4, 13 & Under teams x 4, 39 players in our 11 & Under development squad and Emerging Talent Squad players across 13 & Under and 15 & Under. With low numbers registered for Open trials we made the difficult decision not to proceed with an Open Representative team for 2022.

With Covid concerns still apparent in January 2022 we decided not to proceed with our Annual camp. Whilst disappointing for players and coaches alike the health and safety of our Rep program was paramount.

For the first time in 2 years our teams experienced two full seasons at Waverley and attended all tournaments as scheduled.

Autumn 2022 Waverley - our players and coaches achieved wonderful results with our 13.3s and all 15 & Under teams making finals in their respective competitions. Our 15.2s, 15.3s & 15.4s won their way through to their Grand Finals, whilst results didn't go our way we were extremely proud of our teams. Congratulations to 15.4s player Hayley who was named Most Valuable Player of the Grand Final.



Financial Overview



Treasurers Report

Profit and Loss

For the year ended 31 December 2022, Melbourne East Netball Association made a surplus of \$17,817. 2022 saw our Association back to full strength after COVID. Revenue was back to pre-COVID levels for NSG, Saturday Competition and the Rep Program. Pleasingly, Wednesday Night Ladies Competition and Walking Netball participation rates were also higher than they've ever been. The Café has also experienced a huge turn around — to a profit position – thanks to the efforts of Merryn in controlling costs and rejuvenating the menu.

As a not for profit Association our aim remains to cover our expenses and provide the best programs we can while respecting the contributions of our Clubs, Social Teams and Rep Program Members. With that in mind a small surplus for the year was a desirable outcome.

Having said that, we will continue to pursue appropriate grants and sponsorship opportunities to supplement our income.

Bank Accounts

Melbourne East Netball Association remains debt free and in a strong cash position with \$156,506 Cash at Bank at year end. This healthy surplus allows us to navigate future unplanned events and reinvest in our sport.

As at 16th March 2023, the working accounts totalled \$181,726, and the term deposit balance was \$77,488.

A view to 2022

The stadium closure saw a slow start to the year and played havoc with the budget. Thankfully we were back on court sooner than expected and its now full steam ahead.

We are anticipating expenses to increase given the state of the economy but we are well placed to absorb them. MENA's bookkeeper Julie keeps a very close eye on our expenditure and delivers timely reports to Amy, Carly, Merryn and myself allowing us to react quickly. At this stage, we are well placed to make a small surplus again for 2023.

Today we set our 2024 Affiliation Fees at an unchanged \$10 due by 1st February 2024.
